Description of Changes Since the Healthy People 2020 Launch:

In 2014, the data source name was revised to the "National Immunization Survey (NIS) – Teen" to distinguish this survey from the "National Immunization Survey (NIS)," which samples children between the ages of 19 and 35 months. Neither the data nor the target were revised. In 2015, the baseline year was revised from 2008 to 2012 due to expanding the sampling frame from landline phones only to a dual frame sample including landline and cell phones. The baseline statement was changed from "16.6 percent of females aged 13 to 15 years had received at least 3 doses of human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in 2008" to "28.1 percent of females aged 13 to 15 years had received at least 3 doses of human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in 2012." The target remains unchanged.
